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# What to expect after your Colonoscopy

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#### What advice do I need after sedation?

You have had a sedative injection. Even though you feel wide awake this can affect the way you think and behave for up to 24 hours afterwards. For this reason you need to have someone who can look after you when you go home.

# Please note as you have had sedation, for 24 hours you must not:

- Drive a motor vehicle such as a car or motorbike
- Use appliances that could be dangerous such as a cooker
- Have a bath without someone being there to help you
- Look after children on your own
- Go to work
- Operate any potentially dangerous machinery
- Sign any legal documents
- Take sleeping tablets, drink alcohol or take recreational drugs

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### What can I expect after the test?

You may feel some mild to moderate windy pains in your abdomen (tummy). Although these are unpleasant they are normal and should stop within 24 hours. If you had a polyp removed or a biopsy taken you may see a little bleeding from your back passage.

If you are worried about any symptoms you experience after this test you may ring the helpline numbers on the front cover of this leaflet.

If you have any problems with worsening pain or swelling of the abdomen or heavy bleeding (more than a small cupful) please attend your nearest Accident and Emergency Department taking your endoscopy report with you. Out of hours please contact the NHS non-emergency service on 111.

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The doctor or nurse will speak to you before you leave and explain what was seen and done during the test.
