Advice for using a Silicone Elastomer Conformer

What is silicone conformer?

Silicone conformers are a putty like material that can be moulded to fit your scar.

Why do I need to use a silicone conformer?

To improve the appearance of scars by flattening, softening and reducing red, raised areas.

When do I wear the silicone conformer?

Care of your scar

If the scar shows any signs of deteriorating e.g. splitting, bleeding or increased soreness, stop wearing the conformer and contact your therapist.

Important things to know

- **DO NOT** use creams on the treated areas as this interferes with the conformer's effectiveness.
- **DO NOT** apply to broken skin.

Looking after your silicone conformer

The silicone conformer is usually moulded to fit directly over your scar and will be held in place by your existing night splint. It is best to leave the elastomer attached to the splint to ensure it is placed in the correct position each time it is used.

If the silicone conformer begins to disintegrate or if any problems occur please contact your therapist.
