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Advice following your Breast Outpatient Procedure

This leaflet aims to provide advice for patients following a breast outpatient procedure.

You have had:

An aspiration of a cyst

A freehand/USS guided/Stereo guided Core Biopsy

A Punch biopsy

Wound debridement or resuturing

A vacuum assisted biopsy/excision USS/Stereo guided

Other

Leave the dressing on for 48 hours; it may then be removed. You can replace the dressing with an elastoplast or band-aid but it should not be covered for more than 3 days.

You may experience some discomfort in your breast after the local anaesthetic wears off. This will settle over the next few days. You can take simple painkillers such as paracetamol.

You may be advised to wear a supportive bra for 2 nights following your procedure.

You may go back to work after your procedure but we advise no strenuous exercise (aerobics, decorating or heavy lifting) for 24 hours.

Some bruising around the procedure site is normal and if you feel a lump, this may feel bigger due to swelling inside the breast and this is normal. It will settle over the next week.

If you notice excessive bleeding, swelling or pain please call the breast care nurse; details on the back of this leaflet or your GP.
