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## What has happened today

Today you have had a flexible sigmoidoscopy. Your Endoscopy Nurse or Specialist Screening Practitioner (SSP) will have discussed the results of the test with you immediately after the procedure which will be one of the following outcomes:

- Nothing abnormal was detected during the procedure and the nurse will have given you copies of discharge letters and a post procedure advice leaflet.
- A condition called Diverticular Disease was found during your flexible sigmoidoscopy – an advice leaflet has been provided regarding this.
- Polyps have been removed from your bowel – an advice leaflet has been provided regarding polyps. As soon as these results are available you will be contacted by the screening team to be given the results.
- You have had some samples taken from your bowel. As soon as these results are available you will be contacted by the screening team to be given the results.
- You require a further procedure this will have been discussed with you and arranged by the SSP.

# What can I expect after the test

You may experience some mild to moderate windy pains in your abdomen. Although unpleasant, these are normal and should stop within 24 hours. If you had a polyp removed or a biopsy performed you may experience a little bleeding - this is normal.

- If you have any problems with persistent abdominal pain or bleeding please contact your GP immediately. If it is out of hours please contact the NHS nonemergency service on 111 informing them that you have had a flexible sigmoidoscopy.
- If you feel the problem is more urgent then please attend your nearest Accident and Emergency Department taking your endoscopy report with you.
- If it is an emergency dial 999.

## What happens next

If you would like to discuss your appointment, test or results please do not hesitate to contact the Bowel Screening Team on **01522 597548**.

We are usually in the office between **8.00am and 4.00pm**. There is an answer machine where you can leave a message outside these hours and one of the team will call you back before the end of the next working day.

If your Bowel Scope Screening was normal your screening episode is now complete. You will not be called for screening again until your 60<sup>th</sup> birthday, at which point you will be invited to take part in the Bowel Cancer Screening Programme, when you will be sent a home testing kit in the post.

If you do have any worries or concerns in the interim regarding your bowels, then please do not hesitate to contact your GP practice.
