What is domestic abuse?

Domestic abuse can happen between partners, ex-partners or even a family member and aims to maintain power and control over you.

Domestic abuse can include Physical, Psychological/Emotional, Sexual, Financial, Stalking or Harassment.

Domestic abuse can take place anywhere, not just at home. Anyone can experience domestic abuse regardless of gender, race, religion, ethnic background or disability.

Research has shown that domestic abuse increases over time and the violence gradually gets worse. Whatever the extent of the abuse, domestic abuse can leave victims frightened, isolated, humiliated or ashamed.

It is important not to forget that children living in domestic abuse situations are at risk. They are also victims; children see and hear the abuse which emotionally impacts upon them and they can become at risk from the abuse themselves.

Domestic abuse can take place in any relationship; heterosexual, lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender.

How do I know I'm in a domestic abuse relationship?

Does your partner:

- Get jealous or are they possessive?
- Cut you off from family or friends?
- Threaten to kill or harm the pets?
- Monitor your moves?
- Humiliate or insult you in front of others?
- Verbally or physically abuse you?
- Force you to have sex when you don't want to?

If you said yes to some of these questions you could be in an abusive relationship

Reasons for staying in an abusive relationship:

- Fear
- They promise to change
- Money issues
- Children
- Pets
- Threat to kill
- No one will believe me

What help is there for me?

Q: What should I do if I am or someone I know is in an abusive relationship?

A: Tell ULHT staff who can support you. If a crime has been committed or someone is in immediate danger you should call the police on 999 or 101. You could also contact local support services listed below to seek help, support and advice.
